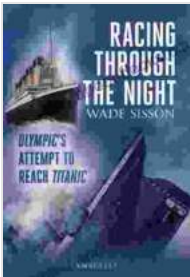


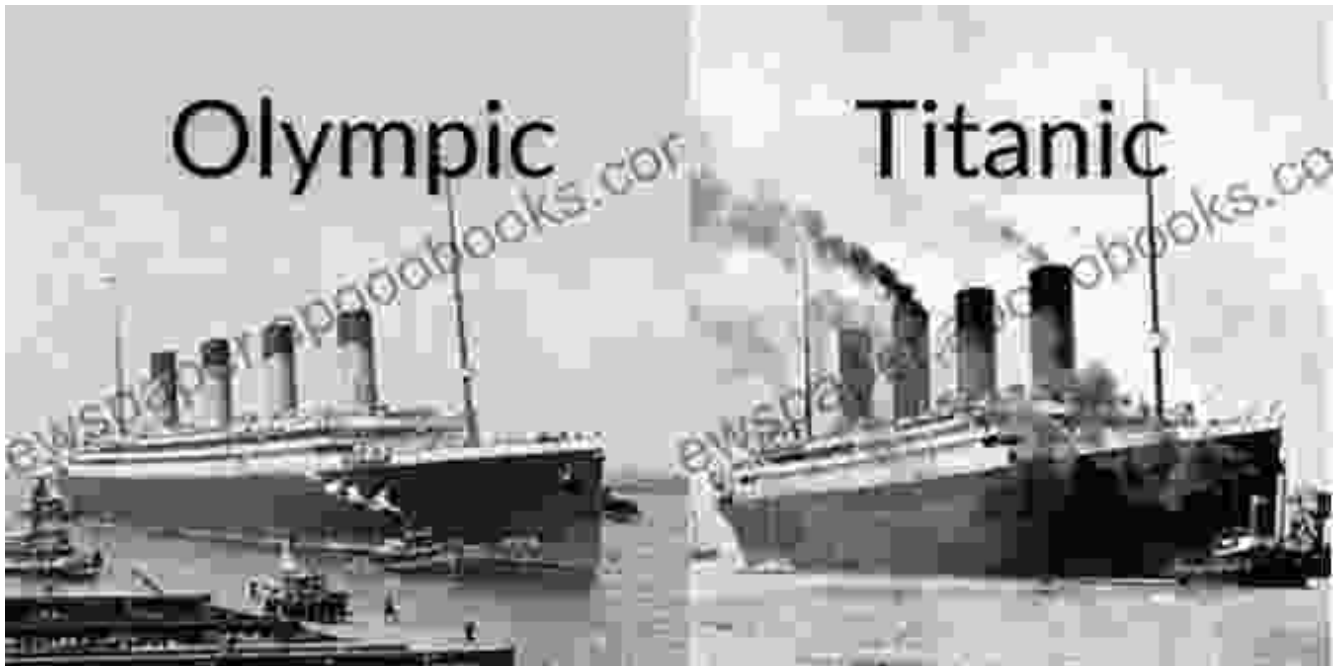

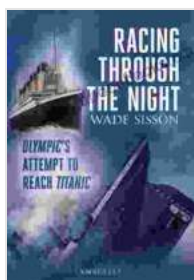

## Timeline of Events

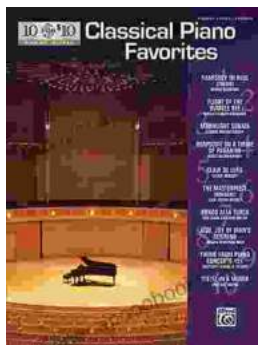
- April 14, 1912: The Titanic sinks after colliding with an iceberg.

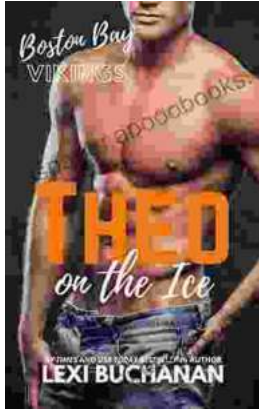
